Dear All,

The next General Assembly of the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics will be held in October or November of 2017. IUPAP asks that members wishing to host the 2017 GA provide a one page expression of interest to me by 20 April.

The Executive Council and the Commission Chairs will then begin discussions with short listed potential hosts with the aim of making a decision towards the end of this year.

I remind you that the IUPAP General Assembly is a small meeting, of 100 to 150 delegates, and to allow all members to attend it does not charge a registration fee. It is preceded by a meeting of the Executive Council and the Commission Chairs (about 40 participants) at the same venue. The General Assembly lasts 3 days and is primarily a business meeting. Traditionally it has had about half a day devoted to scientific presentations, allowing delegates to become familiar with advances in physics by the host, popularising science in the host county, or both. The evening between the meeting of the Executive Council and the Commission Chairs is devoted to a reception and the evening before the final day to a dinner, providing opportunities for interactions among the delegates and between delegates and physicists in the host country.

Because of the business nature of the meeting, delegates will require power for their laptops and it is convenient if they can sit at tables rather than a lecture theatre format.

Because of the absence of a registration fee, hosting an IUPAP General Assembly is not an opportunity for the host to make money. Indeed, a successful General Assembly requires significant support from the host who provides the venue and refreshments during the meeting, and in many cases has provided the reception and the dinner. In some cases the host has provided the meeting website, and in others the IUPAP website has served that role.

Your letter of intent should specify the location of the meetings, the location and costs of accommodation for delegates, the level of support you hope to provide and your thoughts on the format of the meeting and associated publicity

1)There is a few Hotels at walking distance and we may book them as soon as we have the dates. We will work with 3 and 4 stars Hotel and the price at the moment are below US100 / day. With negotiation as a pack we may get a good discount on that. If we decide by another Hotel that need pick up of people, we will organize that, preferable with the bus system of the University.

Dear Alinka and Vanderlei

Thank you for the very interesting proposal you have made to hold the 2017 IUPAP General Assembly in Sao Paulo. I find I need to clarify some of IUPAP's needs and ask some questions of you, so that I can adequately describe the options before us to the upcoming C&CC meeting.

Traditionally IUPAP refers to the meeting as the General Assembly, which lasts for 3 days. However it is actually a combined meeting, in that the Executive Council and the Commission Chairs of IUPAP meet in the 2 days preceding the 3 day General Assembly. Thus we are really asking you to host a 5 day meeting. To help clarify this I attach the agendas for each of the 2014 meetings.

The first meeting is of about 40 people, and for comfort we should have a meeting room to seat 45 people. This a working meeting, and ideally the participants will be seated at tables rather than in lecture theatre style. Does one of the smaller rooms you mention have the capacity to accommodate that many people in that way?

The main General Assembly is a larger meeting, but it is normally less than 150 people. It is also a working meeting, and so the delegates should be able to work on their computers, tablets or with paper. Does the auditorium have seats which would facilitate this?

You mention the costs of the hotels. As IUPAP itself will be paying the accommodation of about 40 people, and we are not a rich organisation, we would hope to keep the hotel cost to 100 USD per night, or less. Is there a suitable hotel within walking distance of the convention center or do we need to arrange for transport? If so, what is the likely cost of the transport, and how long will it take.

Your idea of running a workshop for Latin American Physicists on "New Challenges in pure and applied physics" is very interesting. If you look at the agenda for the three days of the 2014 GA you will see that afternoons were essential devoted to non-business activities — public lectures which in part were to inform the visiting delegates about physics in the region, and visits by delegates to local research laboratories. That suggests that there will be time in a carefully structured program for the workshop, which would certainly promote the visibility of IUPAP in the region. You suggest that the presenters be drawn from delegates to the GA, but is there a possibility for having some speakers from the region, to educate the delegates about physics in Latin America, thus having the workshop serve two purposes.

The C&CC meeting before the GA is a more intense meeting, and does not have time which can be taken away for the workshop. I assume that three afternoons for the workshop will suffice.

As a final question for this note, I am aware that in parts of Brazil the wet season usually starts in late October. Are there climatic or other reasons (national holidays for example) which would prefer, or exclude, particular dates in the October-November period.

I am sorry to be bombarding you with questions, and I'm sure I will have more. But I look forward to your answers

Dear Bruce,

I enquired about hotel costs with my colleagues in Natal. A 4- star hotel (e.g. Praiamar hotel) will charge you daily ~ US\$ 73.00 for a single room and an extra US\$ 15.00 for lunch. A 5- star hotel (e.g. Ocean Palace) charges daily around US\$ 135.00 for a single room with a view to the sea. However it is possible to reduce that to US\$ 104.00 instead.
You will need daily transportation to come from the hotel to the institute and to go back to the hotel after work. This will cost an extra US\$ 250.00 per day for a group for 45 people.
